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Notice Concerning the Impact of the Record Heavy Rainfall by Typhoon No. 10

We would like to express our deepest condolences to all those affected by the record heavy rainfall by Typhoon No. 10 and our wishes for the earliest possible recovery. Canadian Solar Infrastructure Fund, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as “CSIF”) announces that it has conducted a review of the impact upon power generation facilities in connection with the rainfall.

According to the report by Canadian Solar O&M Japan K.K. and Neo K.K., which are the O&M operators for the CSIF, there were seven power plants located in Kyushu region (※) that experienced temporary power outages due to grid power outages on August 30, but all of them have resumed power generation by September 1 afternoon.

According to the confirmed information by 1:00 p.m. on September 2, no damage which affects power generation has occurred to the facilities at other power plants (including Kyushu region) owned by CSIF.

CSIF will continue to monitor and review its portfolio, and additional disclosure will be made should there be any material developments.
